Website Coordinator: <http://www.ozarkasc.com/>. Presently, the Ozark Area Service Committee Guidelines state that one of the duties of the website coordinator is to be responsible for updating and printing schedules for the Ozark Area. This was true for several years, but has not been true since I re-assumed duties in 2013, around June, I believe. In addition, we no longer create and make available email addresses. This, too, should be deleted. It is possible to do this with the website, but in the past it was tedious, complex, and frankly, seldom used and so we stopped.

7.7 The website coordinator also known as web-master duties include:

Requirements: Two years clean time. Access to or own a personal computer with Virus protection and a Firewall, and internet connection.

Term=2 years from October to October (even numbered years)

- a) Maintain the Area website (verify workable links, consistent backups, etc.)
- b) Make all updates to the online meeting schedule in a timely manner. (Monthly)
- c) Report area function information on the activities page.
- d) Upload approved area minutes to archives in a timely manner. (within two months)

- e) Check information of area minutes prior to uploading and remove all personal information such as last names, addresses, and phone numbers.
- f) Add or delete email addresses of trusted servants.
- g) Update NA.org website to reflect Area meeting changes.
- h) Send updated printed schedules to OASC monthly (Change to schedules should be given to the OASC secretary and noted in minutes)
- i) Give written monthly reports to the OASC.

My suggestion would be to remove 7.7.f, 7.7.h of the Ozark Area Service Committee Guidelines.

Also, I would like to see something added that would direct updated schedules to be sent to the Website Coordinator in a digital form. I do not see the job of creating and disseminating schedules under any of the Trusted Servants' Duties.

Last month, a component of the website that utilized a sliding header became outdated. Instead of continuing with the sliding header, I changed the header to a static one. If there are any suggestions as to any modifications needed to the website, then feel free- I have taken a fair amount of license as to the organization and design of the website, but it is Area's call. Just wanted to let everyone know that.

I added a link of approved NA literature. The Narcotics Anonymous of Northwest Arkansas site has this and it seemed like a good idea. <http://naofnwa.org/pages/literature.php>. The NA approved text, in pdf format, cannot be printed out unless you obtain a hack, but it can be viewed online. Most of the other items, such as the materials needed for a meeting, such as the How and Why and Why We Are Here readings, for example, can be printed.

Added: One of the links that the Arkansas site has that NAWS site does not have is a link to the Basic Text 6th Edition. It is a readable version of the basic text. Debra wants to know if she should leave this link on this. Also, Deb's term is up in October of this year. The website is much more user friendly than it used to be.
