Hello Ozark Area. I'm an addict name Ed serving as your RCMA. I did attend the regional meetings last week and it was maybe the best regional I have been to so for. I attended the United States Service Conference of Narcotics Anonymous workshop and it was very informative and interesting. I brought a power point for you to look at so you as GSR's can form your own opinion and share this information with your home groups. I encourage everyone to do their own research on the USSCNA. I am trying to report here what I heard and not what I feel about the USSCNA. They say they are a group of addicts like Jimmy K. with a vision to better serve Narcotics Anonymous here in the U.S.A. NAWS is not in favor of the USSCNA. The USSCNA does practice the 7th tradition and donate money to NAWS. Currently there are about 120 groups that have joined the USSCNA and I think 7 of those groups are in the Show Me Region. A lot of what they have to offer we already have in place with NAWS. The USSCNA say that they can help free up NAWS by the USSCNA taking care of the US and letting world services serve the world. My understanding is that they would be in between world and the regions. The USSCNA has a vision to be a place for sub committees to go and get answers. There was a lot of information to take in there so I am not saying that everything I have here today is 100% correct. I am just reporting what I understood. Once again I encourage everyone to do there own research on this and form their own opion. In loving service Ed H.

During session Saturday, we closed the Ad-hoc committee on the RSO because they had finished their assignment which was multidimensional. It included retaining an attorney, checking to see if the computer could be accessed, and paying the ATT bill and IRS monies owed. Checks were sent to ATT for \$825 and Missouri Dept. of Revenue for \$335. ATT is paid in full, but the IRS cannot tell us if we owe more; Larry R. needs to contact them. The attorney reported that Larry R. (the RSO special worker) had not responded to the letter sent to him asking him to contact the Show-Me Region in order to figure things out with the IRS and American Express Card. The Regional Service Committee (RSC) has decided to leave the ball in his court as to whether or not he would like to contact us. We (RSC) still have retained the services of the attorney for pending further need. It has also been decided to inventory and sell leftover merchandise from the RSO at NA functions starting at Cabin Fever and progressing on to other functions if needed. We sold in excess of \$300 worth of merchandise at Region to put towards our bill with World Services.

Moving on to SMRCNA (Show Me Region Convention of Narcotics Anonymous), Dave M., the chairperson, has requested a need for volunteers to help out. He can be reached at <u>nahappydave@yahoo.com</u>.

Furthermore, I have attached a flier that is requesting members to help out with the Multi-Zonal Service Symposium Workgroup (MZSS). The MZSS offers an opportunity to exchange experience, strength, and hope between members of NA service. The Show-Me Region will be hosting this event and Rob B. our Regional Delegate will be making a donation of \$100 to this event out of his budget. Details of this event are on the flier. Rob will also be attending the Southern Zonal Forum which our region is a part of and will be making another \$100 donation from his budget while participating. In as much as the voting for Regional Chair and Secretary, both have passed. I will add that we still have open positions at Region which include Vice-Chair, Treasurer-her term is up in July '14, Alternate Treasurer, Alternate Secretary, and Alternate Delegate. If anyone is interested, I can get you more information on requirements and duties. As far as the motions are considered, it was deemed out-of-order at this region, although our votes still count for April's Region when guideline changes are due.

Next, there was discussion on the Regional Assembly (RA) which informs our Region on the content of the Conference Agenda Report (CAR). The RA will take place February 15, 2014 at Kemper Arena in Columbia, Missouri at 10:00 a.m. Ed H. and I have discussed between ourselves the need to attend the assembly and we will probably need further funding for it. We're not sure at this point if we both can attend, but hopefully we will know more before the day is over. Otherwise, we (Ozark Area) can have Rob B. (RD) come to us if we decide so. We will have to contact him on a decision before we leave Ozark Area Subcommittee today, then spread the word of its occurrence. In any case, Ozark Area needs to purchase the CAR. I might add that both going to Columbia and having Rob come to us might be beneficial to our Area.

Once again, there was discussion on the PR Concept and there will be a learning day at Region in April. I have little, if any information on this, but will report back at Area in April. Rob is also willing to come down and give us a presentation if we so desire.

The learning day on the S.S.P was basically the same as the one we had in December, except that the PowerPoint was working and there was a handout. I have the handout if anyone would like to read it and see the notes contained on it.

Finally, as per Show-Me Regional Guidelines, twenty-five percent of our yearly budget was withheld to continue business and the rest was sent to World-\$10,240.49. I don't have all the numbers on what was kept and how this was figured due to the fact that monies were still being totaled for incidentals at Region and the hotel costs incurred because of the fat that we didn't meet the required room rentals.


